Family Shelter

We have 48 children staying with their parents at the Family Shelter, of which 28 children are transported to a variety of schools and educational hubs. A few of the parents are able to make their own arrangements, however the Shelter provides transport for 21 of the children to schools in the surrounding areas including Firgrove Primary, Danie Ackerman, Macassar Secondary, and M Power Learning Centre. With 7 of our younger children transported to Op Die Plaas Preschool.

SECTION 18A

Requirements for Issuance

Approved Status

The organization must have received a formal letter from SARS granting section 18A approval and providing a specific s18A reference number.

Eligible Donation Type

The donation must be a bona fide (genuine) donation, either in cash (EFT, credit card) or in kind (goods or property).

No Quid Pro Quo

The donation must be voluntary and gratuitous. You cannot issue a s18A receipt for services rendered (time, effort, or skill), or for donations where the donor receives something in return (e.g., buying a ticket for a charity dinner or auction).

Usage Restriction

The funds must be used solely for the qualifying activities in South Africa.

HOW DO WE MAKE DECISIONS?

Our decision process is transparent and values-based aligned to our criteria. Requests are reviewed by our committee, with additional checks as needed.

STEP 1 : INTAKE

- Funding Request Form (with details of impact, alignment, verification)
- Initial vetting by community member or referrer

STEP 2 : REVIEW

- Core team reviews (Gareth, Gregor, Shane, Wayne, Matthew)
- Checklist: alignment, impact, local relevance and credibility

STEP 3 : DECISION, DISBURSEMENT & ACTION

- Core team (min. 3 members) votes and allocates funding
- Feedback loop after funding, Encourage continued donations or engagement (e.g. "How to get involved" links) & Reporting
- Reports issued in line with SARS NPO requirements - public benefit activities

WHAT DO WE EXPECT FROM MEMBERS?

We expect members to contribute meaningfully - with time, support or sponsorship. We honour each other with respect and shared responsibility.

Minimum:

Attend one event, respect the group with no noise posts, support one cause per year

Ideal:

Host an event, bring in a sponsor, contribute, annual membership and subscriptions
